Fall SAT/PSAT

The change in season this year comes with the opportunity for students in 11th and 12th grade to take the PSAT and SAT in October. This is due to the Spring administration being cancelled because of the COVID 19 crisis. The testing will be free of charge and offered during the school day.

SAT will be held on October 14th. Seniors will attend. However, sophomores and seventh grade will not attend on this date.

We will have SAT makeup for seniors on October 27th. This will be a regular school day. All students scheduled to attend on this day will attend.

Finally, the PSAT will be offered to 11th grade students on October 29th. Juniors will attend this date to take PSAT. Seniors will not attend this date. There will not be a make up date for PSAT.

Elementary-aged students will attend school all of the dates of the SAT/PSAT.

Supporting Success!

Our students cannot be successful without the support and help that learning coaches provide them at home. Here are some tips for success:

- -Make sure your student is doing their daily work. Don't just take their word for it. Actually have the student login and show you what they have accomplished.
- -Emphasize carefully reading and watching the videos in the lesson. This is critical to doing well on the lesson guizzes.
- -Have your student get in the habit of taking notes. They learn note-taking skills at school so they can apply these at home to their studies.
- -Students should work for an average of 5 hours per day. It is essential that your student set and follow a schedule so that they do not get behind. Once students fall behind, they can become discouraged and stop working altogether.
- -Ask questions and ask for help when you need it. Our teachers are here to help.



The Lunch Lizard Is Free Until the End of December!

Grand River Academy has a closed campus for lunch (which means all students remain at Grand River throughout the lunch period). The exception, at this time, is for our juniors and seniors. They may leave campus to purchase food if they are not late to the next class. All students can bring lunch from home.

The district has arranged for the Lunch Lizard food truck to stop by on our onsite school days. They will offer lunch on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, & Thursdays.

Effective 09/02/2020

The US Department of Agriculture (USDA) is extending the Free Meals for Kids program through the end of December 2020, or until available funding runs out. This means that <u>all</u> students in District 51 can access safe, healthy school lunches at no charge to the student's account. This will be available at the Lunch Lizard.

Attendance

Consistent attendance is one crucial piece of the puzzle when it comes to your child's education. Our school is unique in that

attendance is not required every day at our physical location. However, attendance online is required at least 25 hours per week in addition to the time on campus. If your student does not attend the physical campus during a week, then they must work for at least 30 hours at home that week. Students can work at different times of day, they can work on the weekends and miss a few weekdays, but the time on task at home is essential.

It is also vital for students to attend onsite. Our teachers work hard to create lessons that support your student's work in Odysseyware or K-12. Their attendance onsite will help them be successful online. If you have questions about attendance or need help accessing the curriculum, please let us know. We are here to help your student be successful.

Parking and Pickup

As you know, parking is difficult to find around Grand River Academy. That can make drop off and pick up challenging. There is parking on all four sides of the building (14th, Gunnison, 13th, and Chipeta). There is also a 10-minute "loading zone" in front of the building.

Please park off the street when picking up or dropping your students off. Stopping in the middle of the road or double parking causes congestion on an already congested 14th street. It is also unsafe as students have to maneuver through parked cars and onto 14th street to get to awaiting vehicles.
